The 60-minute-long meetings will be open to the public. However, to protect the candidates, students and others, the district will limit the audience to 175. All attendees must also wear a mask, sit in designated socially distanced seating, and leave the venue immediately after the event ends.

Candidate forums are essential because, on General Election Day, Nov. 3, 2020, Lexington County School District One voters will choose four individuals for four at-large seats on the Board of Trustees.
